

*what is “sex”?*

As used in this chapter, “sex” means an individual’s biological sex as either male or female:

- (1) based on the individual’s genetics and reproductive biology at birth, including sex organs, chromosomes, and hormones, without regard to the gender that the individual experiences, identifies with, or expresses; and
- (2) as documented on the individual’s official birth certificate that was entered at or near the time of the individual’s birth modified to correct a clerical error in the individual’s sex.

As used in this code, “sex” means a person’s immutable biological sex as determined by anatomy and genetics existing at the time of birth and evidence of a person’s biological sex.

As used in this section, “sex” means the biological state of being male and female, based on the individual’s nonambiguous sex organs, chromosomes, and endogenous hormone profiles at birth.

For purposes of state/federal law, a person’s “sex” is defined as his or her biological sex (either male or female) at birth.

In this section, “sex” means biological sex.

“Sex” has the same meaning as defined in § 1-3-105(c).

“Sex” means a person’s immutable characteristics of the reproductive system that define the individual as male or female, as determined by anatomy and genetics existing at the time of birth.

“Sex” means biological sex based on chromosomal structure and anatomy at birth.

“Sex” means the binary division of individuals based upon reproductive function.

“Sex” means the biological indication of male and female in the context of reproductive potential or capacity, such as sex chromosomes, naturally occurring sex hormones, gonads, and unambiguous internal and external genitalia present at birth, including secondary sex characteristics, without regard to an individual’s psychological, chosen, or subjective experience of gender.

“Sex” means the biological state of being female or male based on the individual’s sex organs, chromosomes and endogenous hormone profiles.

“Sex” means the biological state of being female or male, based on sex organs, chromosomes and endogenous hormone profiles.

“Sex” means the biological state of being female or male, based on the individual’s nonambiguous sex organs, chromosomes, and endogenous hormone profiles at birth and acknowledged accordingly on the individual’s original birth certificate.

“Sex” means the biological state of being female or male, based on the individual’s nonambiguous sex organs, chromosomes, and endogenous hormone profiles at birth.

“Sex” means the biological state of being male or female based on a person’s chromosomes, in the absence of any of the medically verifiable disorders described in subsection (6)(b) of this section;

“Sex” means the immutable biological and physiological characteristics, specifically the chromosomes and internal and external reproductive anatomy, genetically determined at conception and generally recognizable at birth, that define an individual as male or female.

“Sex” means the organization of the body and gametes for reproduction in human beings and other organisms. In human beings, there are exactly two sexes, male and female, with two corresponding gametes. The sexes are determined by the biological indication of male or female, including sex chromosomes, gonads, and nonambiguous internal and external genitalia present at birth, without regard to an individual’s psychological, chosen, or subjective experience of gender.

“Sex” means the physical condition of being male or female based on genetics and physiology, as identified on an individual’s original birth certificate.

“Sex” means the physical condition of being male or female, as determined by a person’s chromosomes and identified by a person’s anatomy.

“Sex”, the two main categories of male and female into which individuals are divided based on an individual’s reproductive biology at birth and the individual’s genome.

3. "Father" means a parent of the male sex.
4. "Female" means a girl, woman, or an individual whose biological reproductive system is developed to produce ova.
5. "Individual" means a human being.
6. "Male" means a boy, man, or an individual whose biological reproductive system is developed to fertilize the ova of a female.
7. "Mother" means parent of the female sex.

(1) An individual's "sex" means such individual's biological sex, either male or female, at birth;

(2) a "female" is an individual whose biological reproductive system is developed to produce ova, and a "male" is an individual whose biological reproductive system is developed to fertilize the ova of a female;

(3) the terms "woman" and "girl" refer to human females, and the terms "man" and "boy" refer to human males;

(4) the term "mother" means a parent of the female sex, and the term "father" means a parent of the male sex;

(a) "Female" means a member of the human species that, under normal development, produces a relatively large, relatively immobile gamete, or egg, during her life cycle and has a reproductive and endocrine system oriented around the production of that gamete.

(b) "Male" means a member of the human species that, under normal development, produces small, mobile gametes, or sperm, during his life cycle and has a reproductive and endocrine system oriented around the production of that gamete.

- (1) "Female" means an individual whose biological reproductive system is developed to produce ova.
- (2) "Governmental entity" has the meaning assigned by Section 2051.041.
- (3) "Male" means an individual whose biological reproductive system is developed to fertilize the ova of a female.

- (1) "Female" means an individual who is a member of the female sex.
3. "Father" means a parent of the male sex.
4. "Female" means a girl, woman, or an individual whose biological reproductive system is developed to produce ova.
5. "Individual" means a human being.
6. "Male" means a boy, man, or an individual whose biological reproductive system is developed to fertilize the ova of a female.
7. "Mother" means parent of the female sex.

- (4) "Female" has the meaning provided in 1-1-201.
